A group of year five girls designed and made their own bracelets, they also offered a design your own option which proved very popular. From their profits the girls will be making a donation to Cancer Research.











In the Burrow, we have been working really hard on our fine motor skills, number and letter formation, cutting skills, mark making plus many more activities.














Nursery Mrs Disley

Investigation Question:

YEAR THREE Mrs Smith and Miss Fraser

Year 3 enjoyed becoming active investigators this week exploring how water is transported through flowers and plants. The children discovered that the process, by which plants take in water, is called 'capillary action'. The children were thrilled to have the chance to conduct their own experiment to see how the water climbs up the very small spaces in the paper towels, similarly to the tiny tubes in the roots and stems of plants. Many doubted that the water will transport overnight to the empty beaker and were amazed the next morning to find that the water had indeed travelled from one cup to another via 'capillary action'. It was fantastic to see the enthusiasm ooze from both classes and to see the children now carefully comparing their predictions to their observed outcomes, like true scientists. Keep up the fantastic work Year 3!









Investigation question: How do flowering plants disperse their seeds?



YEAR FOUR Mr Kitchener and Miss Belcher

In year 4 this half term we have been studying the Art work of Andy Warhol, and recreating some of his techniques and styles. We have used tracing paper for one of these techniques to imprint a design of a celebrity onto plain paper using pencils. The children also drew portraits of themselves and then decorated one of them with tissue paper and the other with the black line effects and made their faces bright and vibrant with colours to replicate Andy Warhol's designs and techniques he used. Below are some amazing examples of the work which the children have produced throughout the half term.



Investigation Question: what impact have the Egyptians had on modern day life?

YEAR FIVE Miss Lewis and Mrs Redmond

This week in Year 5, to recognise Mental Health Awareness Week last week, we were visited by a parent who introduced the children to Mindfulness Photography. Gemma (Zooey's Mum) showed the children how to create a photograph using cyanotype, which is a camera-less type of photography that uses acetate and light to create an image. They learnt that it was invented by Sir John Herschel (1842) and the process is where the term 'blueprint' comes from. The children used mindfulness to create a picture/collage with dried flowers, which they covered in acetate in a frame, which they then exposed to light – all the time they were thinking about how the process made them feel. After a while, they saw images appear and after sealing the image with water, they were able to see their final photos.

Many thanks to Gemma for coming into school and allowing the Year 5 children to participate in this delightful, calming experience. They had a wonderful time




INVESTIGATION QUESTION:




