Dear Parents/Carers,

Update re. strike action

Following my letter sent on Monday regarding the organised industrial strike action by the NEU, I am writing to update you.

I am able to inform you at this time that **Hedgehogs**, **2R**, **3F**, **3S**, **4B**, **4K**, **5L** and **5R** classes will definitely be closed to pupils on the strike days below. Other classes may be closed, as staff do not have to inform us if they are striking, I may have to announce further class closures to you at short notice. Therefore, we are advising you to organise emergency childcare in case it becomes necessary.

We will endeavour to offer critical workers and vulnerable pupils the opportunity to attend school, if you believe that you are a critical worker and are unable to secure childcare in order to carry out your roll, then please send an email to: admin.wps@osborne.coop. If the school classifies your child as vulnerable, you will be contacted separately.

We are only able to offer childcare where we have capacity. My decision will not be taken lightly but I must ensure the safety and wellbeing of the pupils first.

Confirmed strike dates

- Wednesday 1st February
- Wednesday 1st March
- Wednesday 15th & Thursday 16th March

If your child's class is affected by the strike you will receive a Parentmail communication containing links to teaching videos from the Oak Academy website that the children can carry out whilst at home, linked to their learning in school. They also have access to Doodle, Mathletics, Oddizzi, Spell shed and TT Rockstars where they can carry out additional learning tasks.

For those classes where teachers are not striking, the school will be open as normal on the strike days and those children are expected to be in school.







Over the past 3 weeks the children have been learning all about money and its value! They have worked hard to be able to identify the coins and their colours, understand the value of each coin and note as well as do lots of other things like make change from a pound or compare different amounts of money.














Investigation question: How do you work on achieving your goals and aspirations?

YEAR FOUR Mr Kitchener and Miss Belcher



Investigation question: Why was Æthlred so unready?







YEAR FIVE Miss Lewis and Mrs Redmond



YEAR SIX Mrs Emmerman and Mrs Fogg





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
