Please try a school dinner next Thursday and remember that if your child is in Reception, **Year 1 or Year 2** they are entitled to a free meal every day.





























News From The Resource Base for Deaf Children







Since the start of term the children have been producing work in reflection of a book written by Julia Donaldson called the Gruffalo!


The children have created some fantastic work based on the book. They have created expanded noun phrases to describe the mouse and gruffalo characters and have then moved on to create their own adapted version of the story. They have re-written the story with a new Antarctica setting and have changed their characters to suit their new story. They used a story map to sketch and annotate their new ideas.

The children have shown some real determination considering that this is their first big piece of writing in Year 2. 












Your investigation question:

Year 3 pupils were scientists this week and conducted a science investigation based on the human skeleton. Does the length of your femur affect the distance of your standing long jump? Some pupils predicted that a longer femur gave you the advantage and you then jumped further while others were unsure if there was a correlation between the two. Excitement filled the air as they put their hypothesis into action. They used a tape measure and accurately measured the length of the strongest and longest bone in cm. 



RE - What do I know about the Hindu faith?







YEAR FIVE Miss Lewis and Mrs Redmond
















Spelling Shed is free of charge and aligns with the English National Curriculum.



All children should have their own Spelling Shed log-in details (issued by their class teacher) and they can select the level of difficulty for each game.

Travel News....

Let's Get Active Campaign

On Wednesday, 21st September the children enjoyed a fun assembly hosted by Mrs Clissold from Thurrock Borough Council. Children learnt the benefits from leaving the car at home and visual clues had the children guessing on what the links were to sustainable travel.

Mrs Clissold told the children about a banner design competition, 'Let's get Active' which promotes healthy lifestyles and the advantages of walking, cycling and scootering. Children were invited to design an A4 poster with their name and class clearly labelled ready for judging. All entries are to be in by Friday, 7th October ready for judging. The winning entry will be made into an actual banner for the school's railings.



World Car Free Day

On Thursday, 22nd September Warren promoted World Car Free Day. Staff were asked to use alternative transport and the main car park was closed to staff and visitors. Parents and children also took the challenge with many children walking, scootering and cycling to school.

Our JRSO's visited KS1 and KS2 classes to explain what World Car Free Day was and the benefits from not using a car. Clean air helps the environment, saves money especially with the constant increase of fuel prices. Children also come up with their own ideas such as having fun on the journey's to and from school.

The JRSO's also set their own competition to raise awareness of 'Be Bright Be Seen'. It is not long before we start to see the nights' drawing in and darkness setting in much earlier. Therefore, it is imperative that we educate the pupils to wear bright reflective and florescent clothing in order to be more visible to road users. The Junior Road Safety Officers have asked the pupils across the school to design a flag for our flag post to promote 'Be Bright Be Seen'. All entries must be in by 7th October ready for judging. Again, please make sure that your child includes their name and class.









Road Safety Walks

Last week, pupils in Reception, year 3 and 5 enjoyed Road Safety Walks lead by Leah and Helen from Thurrock Borough Council.

Reception

In reception, parents were also invited to help aid their children to learn about road signs and how to cross the road safely. Both parents and children travelled a short distance around Chafford Hundred whilst learning some very important road safety rules.





Year 3 pupils participated in a short road safety walk around the school. The walk was organised and run by Thurrock Council's Road Safety Officers, Lea and Hannah, The walk was designed to help children learn about the dangers of the road in their local environment. Pupils walked from the school gate in Gilbert Road to Griffon Road and learned how to cross the road safely at 3 different points; they checked for oncoming traffic and looked out for parked cars on driveways. This short but valuable walk provided another opportunity to develop children's safety awareness. In class children then went onto do some activities which reinforced vital lessons in Road Safety.











Year 5 pupils were taught how to cross the road safely. They took a traffic survey logging things such as wearing/non wearing of a seatbelt by drivers and passengers, bad habits whilst driving ie: using a phone and the amount of different road users. The pupils also had the chance of doing a speed test on passing vehicles and were delighted when they guessed the correct speed.
