About our School

Warren Primary School has been situated in the North West area of Chafford Hundred since 1997. We are a community school, which is part of the Osborne Academy Trust, catering for approximately 500 children aged 3-11. The school building is modern, spacious and on a single level, allowing excellent access to pupils and adults. Our facilities accommodate 15 classrooms, including a Foundation Unit and outside learning environment for our children in Nursery and Reception. We benefit from two halls, a fantastic library and a resource base for deaf children. We have extensive grounds with hard surfaces, a spacious playing field, adventure play equipment, gym equipment and forest school.

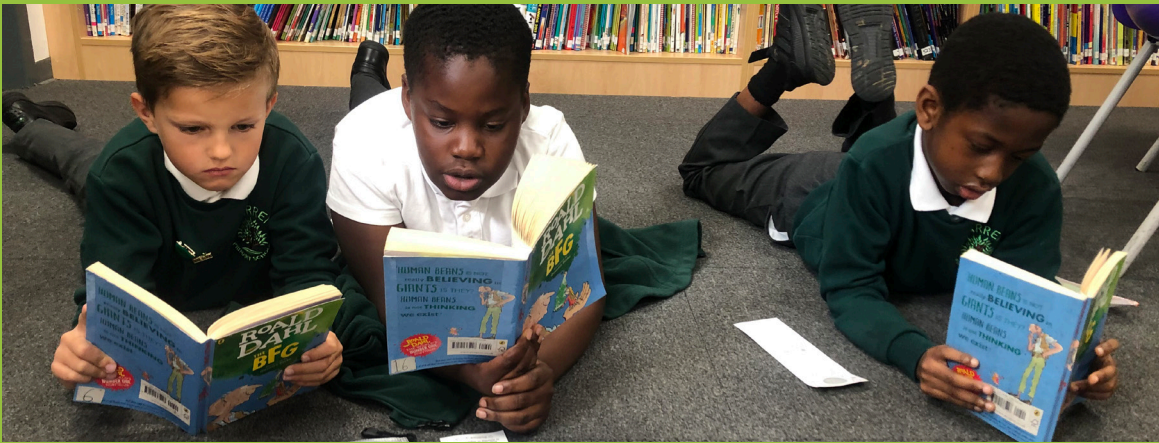
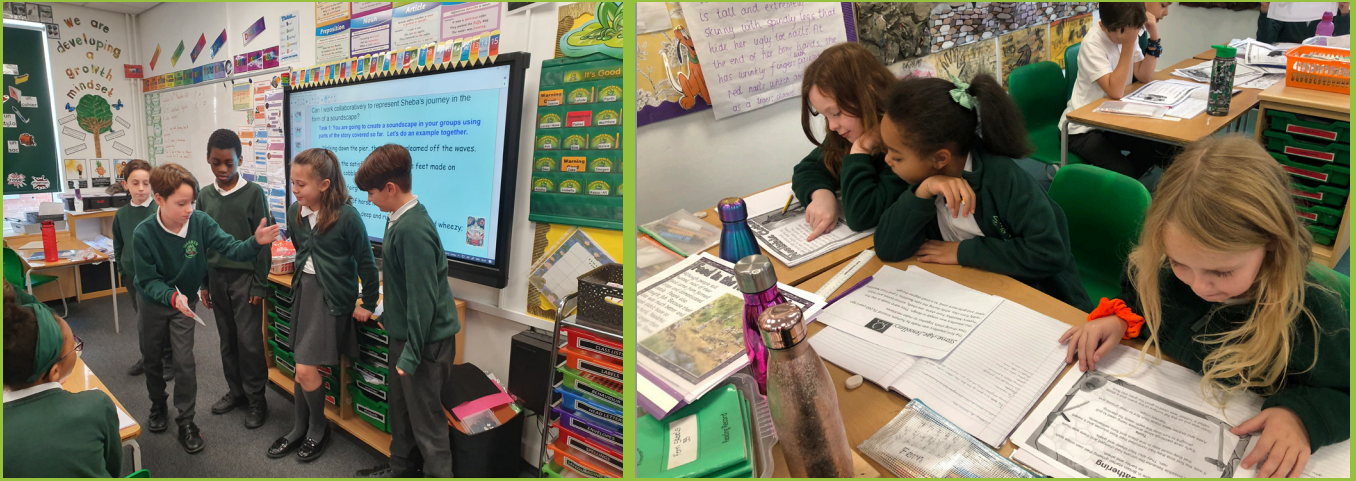
We are a highly inclusive, two-form entry school with an intake of 60 children in each cohort. Each year group consists of 2 mixed ability classes, with two teachers who plan together to ensure pupils have similar learning experiences.

The Curriculum

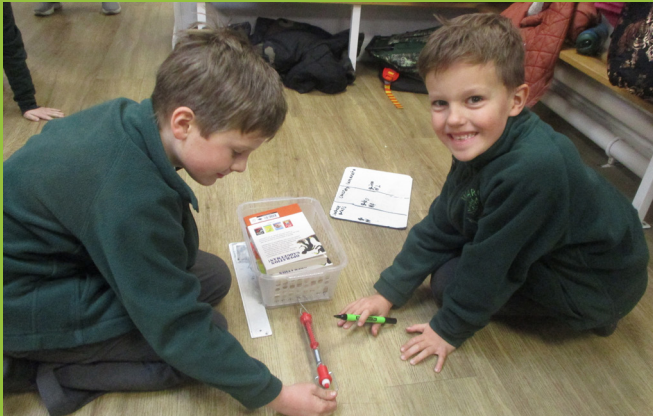
At Warren Primary our curriculum is based upon the skills that children need to develop to be successful life-long learners. We offer an inclusive curriculum which is adapted as necessary to suit the needs of our learners.

From an early age we develop a love of reading through shared stories and a systematic approach to teaching synthetic phonics which transfers to a curriculum which has quality texts at its heart. This approach allows children to develop as fluent readers and creative writers who have a good grasp of grammar.

As a school we are developing a mastery approach to the teaching of mathematics through our engagement with maths mastery specialists; from an early age we develop mathematical fluency and reasoning in our children using concrete, pictorial and abstract materials.

We believe that children's educational experiences should be broad and balanced and should expose them to the best that has been thought, said and created. Our curriculum has particular strengths in music and sport but we ensure a broad grounding in the humanities, arts and sciences.





Our Vision and Values

Warren Primary School is committed to working in partnership with children, parents, carers and the wider community to ensure success for all pupils in all areas of their lives. We are dedicated to offering all children the opportunity to develop, succeed and achieve in a safe, happy and inclusive environment – regardless of their individual ability, gender, beliefs, ethnic heritage or language. Forest School

We are lucky enough to have our own Forest School at the back of our school field which is used by children in Early Years and Key Stage 1.

Forest School is a child-centred inspirational learning process, that offers opportunities for holistic growth through regular sessions. It develops confidence and self-esteem through learner inspired, hands-on experiences in a natural setting.

Our fully trained members of staff have built up an exceptional outdoor area for the children which supports play, exploration and supported risk taking. Children are taught to use tools safely and have the opportunity to participate in a range of activities including playing in the mud kitchen, den building and campfire cooking.

We also offer a holiday club for children of primary school age from all schools.



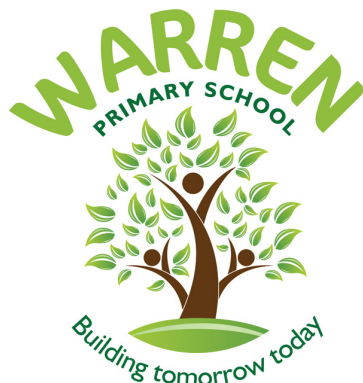
Extra-curricular activities
