




Nursery Mrs Disley and the Nursery Team






Hedgehogs and Rabbits

The children really impressed us with their maturity and the approach they took towards their work. They then designed their own envelopes to post their letters in to make sure that they attracted the Kings attention.


We are now waiting to see if the King replies!

YEAR SIX Mrs Emmerman and Mrs Fogg




We have had a busy week in Year 6. Many of Yr6 had gone to PGL, Liddington, however, a number of us have enjoyed some planned school activities.


